## Gala Raises \$26,000 For BCCU#2

Approximately \$26,000 was raised for the Bond County Community Unit #2 Academic Foundation at the fourth annual "Light The Way Gala" fundraising event on Saturday.

That total included about \$16,600 from the silent and live auctions, plus another \$10,000 from sponsorships, ticket sales and a 50-50 drawing, according to Dr. William Beckert, president of the foundation.


"It always surprises me how people are willing to go over the top in the auction – all to support educational opportunities in the district. Some of the bidding gets pretty competitive."

He said that the purpose of the event is to provide resources for programs that the district otherwise wouldn't be able to provide.

"The teacher grants allow them to go above and beyond – to do things that capture the imagination of the students and get them excited about learning," Beckert said. "This year it also goes to establishing the STEM program, which will expose students to new technology and advanced learning opportunities in the areas of science, technology, engineering and math.
